



Year 2 Learning – Spring 1 2026

<p>Daily reading sessions support the children to build on their vocabulary, fluency and comprehension skills.</p>  <p>In our English lessons, we will be writing a set of instructions on how to look after a lost animal and a narrative all about a misunderstood character!</p> 	<p>Money We will learn to recognise and count coins and notes, make and compare amounts and find change. They will also solve simple money problems.</p> <p>Multiplication and Division We will learn that multiplication and division are about making and sharing equal groups, using practical resources, arrays and number sentences. They will develop fluency with the 2, 5 and 10 times-tables, explore doubling, halving and odd and even numbers.</p> 	<p>Overarching question: Who are the real heroes?</p> <p>We will be exploring what makes someone a hero and creating simple timelines to understand the past. We will study the significant contributions of Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Ernest J Grant and consider how their actions have shaped healthcare and life today.</p> 	<p>Overarching question: What do living things need to survive, and what do humans need to thrive?</p> <p>We will learn about life cycles and how humans grow and change. We will explore ways to stay healthy, including healthy eating, exercise and the importance of sleep and how these choices affect our bodies.</p>
