Swimming attainment

18 out of 19 pupils - 95% (no data for one pupil - marked as not meeting expected level).

17 out of 19 pupils - 89% (no data for one pupil - marked as not meeting expected level).
- Number and percentage of Year 6 pupils who can perform safe self-rescue skills in various water-based situations:

Subscription to Complete PE	2, 3 and 5	£180	Complete PE provides our staff with a clear structure for lessons, with a breakdown of the learning the children will be taking part in. It is sequenced in a progressive manner, allowing us to develop children's attainment across age groups. The program is having a sustained impact on our teachers' abilities to lead sports-based activities.
Sports Day items	1, 2 and 5	£13.98	Stickers to celebrate the occasion.
Transport to swimming (top up) and sports events - coach hire	1, 2, 4 and 5	£2,244	Enhancing our swimming offer has allowed us to improve our children's ability to not only be able to swim at a basic level, but to be able to swim proficiently and confidently, for children in KS2. More children in year 6 met the minimum requirements than expected as a result. Some children have fostered a love of swimming and now attend swimming outside of school hours too.

			Attending the QEGS and Primary Stars events packages allowed all of our children in EYFS-Y6 to take part in interschool sports competitions.
Primary Stars events package	5	£450	Subscribing to the Primary Stars events package allowed all of our children in reception to year 2 to take part in interschool sports and physical activity based competitions.
Kiddi Active top up	1, 2 and 4	£1215.62	Our nursery children and some children in reception attended Kiddi Active sessions throughout the year. This has allowed us to establish strong foundations in physical literacy and active play for our nursery children. Four additional children in nursery are now on-track to meet the ELG for gross motor skills, largely due to the Kiddi Active sessions. This year's reception cohort benefitted from a similar offer last year and all met the ELG for gross motor this year. This helps the children in the wider curriculum, particularly as they progress through school and are expected to sit on the carpet and at tables for set periods of time.
Primary Stars provision	4	£4,736.68	Our children got to experience a range of different sports, exercises and physical activities including, but not limited to: invasions games, kabaddi, footgolf, parkour, caving, dodgeball, boccia, tri-golf and archery. This allowed children to access activities that they may not have done so otherwise.
Young leaders programme	2, 4, 5	£1032.33	Children in year 5 and 6 were given the opportunity to enrol on a young leaders in sport programme with Primary Stars. The programme coaches the children in leadership, and they gain prestige through reaching various milestones. In total, 5 children achieved their gold award. These children will be supported through leading lunchtimes sport/exercise games next year and will also be able to support at the Primary Stars sports events.
Enrichment opportunity	4	£199	Children in year 6 received a morning of laser tag. They thoroughly enjoyed it and some children expressed an interest in taking part in laser tag outside of school.
QEGS events package	5	£500	Attending the QEGS events package allowed all of our children in KS2 to take part in interschool sports competitions.
Top up swimming lessons	1 and 4	£2,388	Enhancing our swimming offer has allowed us to improve our children's ability to not only be able to swim at a basic level, but to be able to swim proficiently and confidently, for children in KS2. More children in year 6 met the minimum requirements than expected as a result. Some children have fostered a love of swimming and now attend swimming outside of school hours too.
Bikeability bike hire	4	£120	Hire of bikes through Cycle Derby. All year 6 children took part in a 2 day course. By the end of it, 16/17 children were able to ride a bike, including on the road.

Resources for EYFS playground	2	£3,294.79	Contribution to a range of developments on the EYFS playground, including resurfacing, sheds, a sandpit and bikes. This equipment will support children in meeting ELG in fine and gross motor for years to come. It will help to promote physical activity and exercise in EYFS.
Cover for SG leadership time - 2.5 days	2	£600	Cover SG to carry out lesson observations, provide feedback, prepare sports day, monitor PE spend, arrange events, prepare risk assessments, etc.
